The second half of the 4-H Charter Renewal Application is due by **Mon., Oct. 28**. Club members will help with the application by helping to plan your 4-H Club's annual calendar. (Think about who you'd like to have for programs/speakers at your monthly club meetings, field trips, activities, etc.) Club members will also help come up with one or two annual club goals.



The 4-H Junior Council sponsored a scavenger hunt during the Rock Co. 4-H Fair on Sat., July 27 from 5-7 p.m. at the Blue Ribbon Pavilion. Participants had to take photos with their cell phones of a list of 27 items located around the fairgrounds. Cash prizes were awarded to the five fastest teams. "Team Laura" came in first with 13 minutes and received \$30. Second place was the "Goat Kids" who completed the challenge in 14 minutes. They won \$25. Rock County 4-H Awards and Recognition

The Rock County 4-H Awards process is a great way to be recognized for all you have accomplished this 4-H year by applying for a chance to win awards and trips! There is something for everyone from first year Cloverbuds, to high school graduates, to leader recognition.

Project/Activity Award Forms:

Members in K – 7th grades can complete a Project/Activity Award Form to be eligible for project and activity awards.

Members in 8th – 13th grades can complete the Project/Activity Award Form to be eligible for project and activity awards, as well as special awards in the areas of Agriculture, Dairy, Woodworking, Horticulture, Home & Family, Companion Animal, and Community Service.

The **Junior Award Form** for 5th – 7th grade members is a simple two-page form. Applicants are eligible to win trips and awards for Space Camp, Outstanding Junior Member, Day Trip, and Challenge Award depending on their grade.

The **Resume and Cover Letter** process is for youth grades 8 and up. This is great practice for a future job hunt or college application process. Everything you need to know is in the resume packet, available on the Rock Co. 4-H website. Award interviews will be Sat., Sept. 28. In the event that there is a scheduling conflict, Tues., Sept. 24 is the alternate date and must be asked for in the cover letter. By following the guidelines in the packet and depending on grade, members are eligible for:

The **4-H Clover Award** is for Cloverbuds through last year in 4-H and is our only award based solely on participation. Everyone who applies can win a Clover Award!

The **Outstanding Leader Award** is available for anyone (member, leader, or parent) to nominate someone who is an outstanding leader. At least one leader will be selected in each of the four groups based on their years of 4-H leadership: 1-5 years, 6-10 years, 11-15 years, and 16 and more!
