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PROJECT NAME	DESCRIPTION
Rotary Botanical Gardens: Grounds and Gardens	Caring for or maintaining a general or specific garden area as directed by RBG staff. Activities can include weeding, watering, planting, preparing gardens for a special event, etc. Does not include tours.
Rotary Botanical Gardens: Youth Education	Works directly with RBG Education staff and as directed by staff to provide educational offerings for youth and families, including school programs and tours, Story and Stroll program, etc.
Rotary Botanical Gardens: Special Events	Provides supportive services or educational programming for special events at RBG under the direction of RBG staff. Activities at events such as Earth Day, Home Garden Tour and plant sales. Not all special events qualify for volunteer hours.
Rotary Botanical Gardens: Adult Education	Work directly with RBG staff and as directed by staff to work as a garden docent, ambassador or tour guide, lead guided walks, or participate in adult education activities.
Janesville School of the Blind and Visually Impaired	School garden maintenance and educational programming at the school's garden. Activities can include assisting with the maintenance of the school garden, the design and implementation of educational programs for WCBVI staff and students at their on-site school gardens. All activities are done in accordance with the school's direction and guidance.
RECAP	Work directly with RECAP inmates in gardening related activities at the community garden, RBG, or other approved locations. Could also include presentations given to RECAP about gardening topics.
Misc. Projects	Use this to report volunteer activities not included as their own report
Answering Garden Questions	Includes all efforts to answer gardening questions with a MG booth or display table at farm markets, county fairs, and other public events at various locations.

Backpack Program	Volunteers deliver educational programming at local schools through the use of pre-designed program and supplies (backpack kits) that can be used by students with an MGV leader, at the school grounds learning about different topics.
Pollinator Project - Gardens and Outreach	Participate or lead garden projects or community educational programming specifically to address pollinator habitat and conservation.
Edgerton Hospital - Healing Garden	Participate in gardening activities at Edgerton Healing Garden, which may include involvement with the design and planning, planting and weeding, or other garden maintenance as required to keep the garden productive and safe.
Community Sharing Gardens in Beloit	Community Action maintains a six city-lot community sharing garden in Beloit's Merrill Neighborhood. Volunteers are needed to assist with garden maintenance, lead volunteer groups, and can provide educational programs at the garden.
RPMGA	Provides administrative support for RPMGA activities, meetings, association membership, Facebook and blog communications, manage supplies, etc.
Grinnell Hall Garden Club	Present gardening related programs to the public through the garden club at the senior activity center.
Community Presentations - Adult Education	Present educational programs, share locally relevant knowledge and resources to adult learners at a public location on a horticulture related topic. Examples include presentations at your local library, community center, or other public venues.
Newsletter	Newsletter for RPMGA members and publicly available on website - To inform members and visitors of pollinator friendly plants, volunteer opportunities, educational activities and articles pertaining to gardens and nature.
Paw Print Park	Participate in prairie restoration efforts through identifying and planting native species, identifying and removing invasive species and other restoration and gardening efforts in collaboration with Paw Print Park leaders.

<p>Community Presentations - Youth Education</p>	<p>Present educational programs and share locally relevant knowledge to children, youth or families at a public location on a horticulture related topic. Examples include presentations at a local school, library or community center. This is separate from the RBG - youth education project category</p>
<p>Special Project - Macktown Gardens</p>	<p>Special project to restore historical site and gardens at Macktown Living History Education Center; Caring for or maintaining a general or specific garden area in alliance with Museum's goals. Activities can include weeding, watering, planting, preparing gardens for a special event, etc.</p>
<p>Citizen Science Projects</p>	<p>Volunteers that participate in citizen science projects at public gardens (such as Rotary or other public garden spaces in the community).</p>
<p>Public Garden Spaces</p>	<p>Participate in any gardening activity at a public garden area such as church, library, government center, town hall, etc. Gardening activities may include involvement with the design and planning, planting and weeding, or other garden maintenance as required to keep the garden productive and safe. The garden must be accessible to the public and would involve the support of the hosting organization.</p>
